All filming will be done using their/your own phone and will be very brief. The videos will be placed on the STAR-JIA website and shown to potential participants.

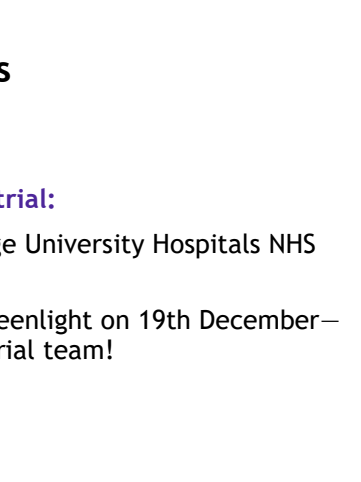

The trial is now at 12 participants!

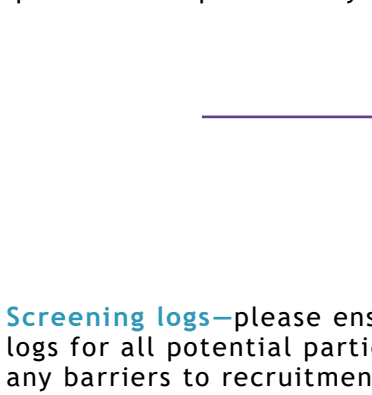
